This document provides general information on the sanctions against Russia (and Belarus) only. For concrete cases and questions, the legal basis and view of the competent authorities should be consulted.

1. Export of maritime navigation goods and radio communication technology to Russia (9 March)

- A prohibition has been put in place for **sale, supply, transfer or export**, directly or indirectly, of maritime navigation goods and radio communication as well as any **technical support, financing support**, whether or not originating in the EU, to any natural or legal person, entity or body in Russia, for use in Russia, or for the placing on board of a Russian-flagged vessel
- The prohibition **does not apply for nonmilitary use and for a non-military end-user**, intended for humanitarian purposes, health emergencies, the urgent prevention or mitigation of an event likely to have a serious and significant impact on human health and safety or the environment, or as a response to natural disasters
- The competent authorities may authorise the sale, supply, transfer or export of the goods and technology or the provision of related technical or financial assistance, for non-military use and for a non-military end-user, after having determined that such goods or technology or the related technical or financial assistance are intended for maritime safety
- Scope of maritime goods covered:
 - Navigation equipment as defined in Chapter 4 of [Implementing Regulation 2020/1170](#) for the Marine Equipment Directive
 - Radio-communication equipment as defined in Chapter 5 of [Implementing Regulation 2020/1170](#) for the Marine Equipment Directive
